The Cupboard hours and day have changed to Friday 11:00 am - 2:00 pm every week. The change was made, because on Thursdays fresh vegetables are available at the Food Bank. This allows us to give the families fresh vegetables.

The list of clients continues to grow each month through the contacts with United Way, Salvation Army, medical offices and word of mouth. The Cupboard has helped in many ways other than food by helping with gas, prayer, hugs, praise, furniture of all sorts, and clothes. The clients themselves offer to help when we are swamped. This helps them feel good about themselves. They feel they have something of value to give.

There is one client that very faithfully comes every week to help with the unloading of the food. We are very happy to see him, and he is the kind of person that lifts up others.

The Cupboard is still in need of a working refrigerator and freezer. As needs grow, there is a need for more storage. We seem to be growing every month!


