

This year the month of April was filled with several beautiful, meaningful, and spiritual worship experiences. Remember the Maundy Thursday service when the emphasis was on love? A handmade, cloth heart went home with you as a reminder of the love Jesus demonstrated to his disciples as he washed their feet and ate the Last Supper with them.

This was followed by the joyous celebration on Easter morning with the choir singing, "Allelulia! Christ is Risen! Allelula! He's Alive." Those words and many others still sing in our ears. We continued our worship together with themes such as *We Believe, Hope Is Fulfilled*, and *Hear Christ's Voice*.

During the May communion service, we learned to say the South African word, Ubuntu. We learned that it means "We Are One," and we were inspired by the words of great leaders who shared the ideas of Ubuntu with us. We explored what it means to *Love One Another*. During the first worship services in May, a gardener shared a meditation about bearing fruit, about the need for pruning to get rid of the suckers, and about being strongly connected to the vine. We were encouraged to rest "By Streams of Living Water" to renew our spirit and to help us see what is really important.

On May 24 the word "Ruach" will be introduced. Do you know what it means? Here's a hint. This word is used in the description of the Holy Spirit in the Hebrew Bible. This Sunday we will celebrate Pentecost when we will hear about the strange and wonderful event that occurred when friends and disciples of Jesus were gathered. The following Sunday is Trinity Sunday when we celebrate the Christian doctrine of the Trinity: God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.


As we move into the months of June, July, and August, the following themes will be explored during the Sunday morning worship time: Who Shall Reign?, See with God's Eyes, Called to Mission, Live in Love, Sing to the Lord to name only a few. These themes and their supporting scriptures will offer many opportunities for vibrant worship experiences. Since our congregation is somewhat smaller during the summer months with our northern members gone and people on vacations and attending camps, your attendance is particu-

larly important to those who prepare and present the services.

Worship is an important time for us to encounter God through the various elements of the worship service. These elements include songs, words (in prayers, scriptures, testimonies, and lessons), and sacraments. We are encouraged to reflect on our lives and seek forgiveness for actions we might regret. Worship brings us to a point where we are better able to hear God's call to be Christ-like servants. Make attendance at our weekly worship services a priority in your summer plans.



This quarter we will be taking the money we raise and donating it to the Greenville, South Carolina congregation. Our very own JaAna Skene Parham-Schwartz is the pastor of this congregation. They are experiencing a growing ministry that provides a safe place for area kids. The ministry started as a one night a week event during the school year as a place to go to get help with homework and a safe place to stay. The number of children involved has grown. The congregation continues to provide food, games and a place to feel safe and loved. They have expanded the program to continue through the summer. The congregation is in a very depressed area and with school out for the year, many of these kids will be hungry when the school lunch program stops. They still need a safe place during the summer as well.

Rick Schwartz wants to build a Gaga Pit for the kids to enjoy. Gaga is a type of dodge ball played in an octagonal or hexagonal pit using a foam dodge ball. It has been determined the cost of the pit to be \$900 and lots of sweat equity. Any money over the \$900 needed can be used to help offset the cost of the meals that are provided for these children. Even pizza can become expensive when you are providing it out of your own pocket. Help us help one of our own congregations as they do the work of Christ in their community and provide a safe place, a warm meal, and a hug for the children.
