

Discernment:

The Call of God to a Prophetic People

The surest evidence that the *Community of Christ* membership is growing spiritually is the encouragement of the World Church Leadership for individual members and congregations to seek divine understanding about critical issues facing the church. The call of God is for the church to seek to become fully a World Church equally yoked with Jesus Christ and with each other.

A current issue that we are asked to pray about, discuss and be open to the Holy Spirit's direction is the matter of "Conditions of Membership" - specifically as to the need to rebaptize persons who want to be part of the *Community of Christ*. As individuals and as a body of believers, we need to explore our current feelings and beliefs regarding this important issue even as we seek further understanding from God. Perhaps nothing will change or perhaps the 2010 World Church Conference will determine that one's personal commitment to Jesus

Christ through baptism in another denomination could be acceptable in order to become a member of the *Community of Christ*, along with confirmation by the laying on of hands by the elders.



The discernment process of prayer, study and discussion will help you personally and help the body of the church have a Holy Spirit confirmed understanding of God's will in this matter as it applies to our day and time. Isn't it wonderful that God trusts us enough to have us seek more light and truth? Isn't it wonderful that the leadership that God has provided for the church also trusts us and encourages us to seek our own understanding?

This will be very helpful to you in making an informed decision. To further help us in this discernment process, **Small Group Discussions** will be offered so that we can explore and confer together. Two group meetings are being planned as of now and will be held on **Sundays, October 4 and October 18 at 9:45 AM in Classroom 4**. The invitation is to all. FINANCIAL UPDATE

Operating Budget for 2009 is \$60,031:

Income through August 2009	\$35,308
Expenses through August 2009	<u>33,422</u>
Balance ending August 2009	\$ 1,886

It is a good feeling knowing that we are on the plus side; however, we should have 67% of the 2009 Budget in as of August, and we only have 58%. This is a shortfall of \$4,912.

Our Budget is much like yours, not all expenses come in equally each month of the year. Hopefully, we will keep the balance in the plus column.

At recent worship service with the theme *Plant Peace*, the story of Sadako Sasaki was told. When the atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima, Japan, Sadako was only two years old. She knew little of world politics or wars. All she knew was that her young life was destroyed. She developed leukemia as she grew up. Sadako latched on to the legend of the crane, and the tradition that if she folded 1,000 cranes she would be granted her dearest wish. Her wish was for world peace. She folded crane after crane and hoped her wish would come true. Unfortunately, the leukemia was too much for her young body and at age 12 she died. Others folded the remaining cranes, and she was buried with 1,000 cranes.

Paper cranes were hung over the podium as a worship center and were distributed to all those in attendance during the worship service as a reminder of world peace.
